General FAQs

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As part of the [Publications Strategy](#) , academic staff are required to deposit where copyright allows, all research papers (including journal articles and conference papers) into IRep upon publication or as soon as possible thereafter. Staff are asked to provide the version of their paper that is as close as possible to the published version. Bibliographic details of all other research outputs should be deposited in IRep.

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There are two ways of making your publications open access:

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**What do I need to provide for IRep?**

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It is advisable to create and keep your own pre-prints, post-prints and publisher's version of research publications.
